

Protecting your supply chain

- Verify your suppliers and/or your customers are ready for business—if your supply chain or customers cannot support your operations, it may be too soon to reopen
- Secure maintenance services (including replacement parts) for critical machinery
- Develop new partnerships with suppliers in case your existing supply chain is interrupted
- Control the inventory of raw materials to meet the new needs of your customers and your new products and services
- Consider reducing the production rate to minimize stress on employees and machinery as you get back up and running
- Verify that the new safety measures can meet your objectives and product quality standards—if not, ask a health and safety specialist to recommend adjustments
- Evaluate the quality of the water or other elements needed in your production process
